ABU DHABI FACTS

- On the men's race, 4 former World Champions are lining up: Jonathan Brownlee (2012), Mario Mola (2016, 2017 & 2018), Vincent Luis (2019 & 2020) and Kristian Blummenfelt (2021)
- On the women's race, Flora has three World Championships under her belt (2016, 2017 & 2021) while Georgie Taylor Brown has one title (2020).
- The men lining up this Saturday have won in total 57 World Triathlon Championship Series. Mario Mola 16; Jonny Brownlee 13; Vincent Luis 6; Alex Yee 4; Kristian Blummenfelt 3; Richard Murray 3; Hayden Wilde 2, Henri Schoeman 2; Dorian Coninx 2; Jelle Geens 2; Joao Silva 2; Jake Birtwhistle 2.
- On the womens field, they have achieved 27 WTCS wins: Flora Duffy 14; Georgia TB 5; Taylor Knibb 2; Cassandre Beaugrand 2; Summer Rappaport 1; Maya Kingma 1; Emma Jackson 1; Laura Lindemann 1
- Only Flora Duffy of the whole field knows what it is to win in Abu Dhabi, even though on a different course, on the F1 circuit. On the men's field, Mario Mola has won three times in Abu Dhabi, while Jelle Geens and Henri Schoeman have one victory each.
- Only 21 years old, Ricardo Batista (POR) is the youngest man racing on the Elite World Championships. Vasco Vilaca (POR), Miguel Hidalgo (BRA) and Sergio Baxter (ESP) are 22 years, could have raced on the U23 World Championships but decided to move on to compete against the elites.
- On the women's field, youngest athlete is Emma Lombardi, 21 years, U23 world champion last year and that has been on the WTCS podium this season, finishing second in Cagliari
- Some athletes racing the U23 World Champs have had really good results on the WTCS circuit this season: Paul Georgethum (FRA), finished second in WTCS Hamburg 2021, while Kate Waugh was 9th in that same race. 2019 Junior World Champion Bianca Seregini (IOTA) finished in 10th place at the WTCS Bermuda 2022.

COURSE MAPS

PARA TRIATHLON

The course will comprise 1 lap of 750m in an anti-clockwise direction for the Para triathlon World Championship or 1 lap of 150m for the Open Para triathlon mixed relay. At the end of the lap the exit ramp will take the athletes up on the pontoon and into the race village and transition.

The average water temperature at this time of the year is approximately between 26 – 30°C. Wetsuits for Para triathletes are mandatory.

The Bike course will comprise 5 laps in an anti-clockwise direction for the Para triathlon World Championship and 1 lap in an anti-clockwise direction for the Open Para triathlon

Mixed Relay. The Bike course is fast and has some technical sections within the YAS Bay precinct. The athletes are cycling outside the race village and will enter the venue on the last lap of the bike.

The run course will comprise 2 laps in an anti-clockwise direction for the Para triathlon World Championship and 1 lap for the Open Para triathlon Mixed relay. The run course is fast and flat along the promenade. At the end of the last lap the athlete heads up the Blue carpet, runs around the Para triathlon transition and then goes to the Finish line.

For the Para triathlon mixed relay only the last athlete runs to the finish, the 1st/2nd and 3rd athlete will complete the run segment at the end of promenade next to the swim pontoon.



ELITE & U23 RACES

The swim will take place in front of the Race Village from Pier 71. The swim start will be a dive start off the pontoon. The course will comprise 2 laps of 750m in an anti-clockwise direction.

The average water temperature at this time of the year is approximately between 26 – 30°C (degrees Celsius). With the current weather conditions, it is expected to be a non wetsuit swim.

The Bike course will comprise of 9 laps for the Elite and 8 laps for the U23 in an anti-clockwise direction, it is a slightly different course for the Elites (each lap 5km) and U23s (each lap 4.4 km). The Bike course is fast and has some technical sections within the YAS Bay precinct. Each lap takes the athlete back to the race village through Elite Transition for the start of each new lap transition.

The course will comprise 4 laps in an anti-clockwise direction. The run course is fast and flat in the YAS Bay precinct. Each lap takes the athlete back to the race village through Elite Transition for the start of each new lap transition. At the end of the fourth lap the athlete heads up the Blue carpet and across the Finish line.

PRIZE MONEY

Each World Triathlon Championship Series race offers a total of \$150,000 in prize money (half for the men, half for the women), offering cash until the 20th position. On the World Triathlon Championship Finals Abu Dhabi, a total of \$280,000 will be distributed (equally between men and women) amongst the Elite athletes, while the U23 athletes will receive \$60,000. The bonus pool will offer a total of \$750,000 to the top men and women on the Maurice Lacroix World Triathlon Rankings after Abu Dhabi Finals.

As in previous years, the bonus pool will extend to the top 35 athletes, with the male and female World Champions each taking home \$80,000 following the Championship Final in Abu Dhabi event on top of the prize money they earn at each event.

In 2022 World Triathlon offers a total prize money purse of 3.5 million USD.

[The men's 2022 title contenders and how they can become World Champion](#)

Currently spearheaded by Hayden Wilde and Alex Yee, of the 149 men who have started a WTCS this year, mathematically speaking there are nine names on the Maurice Lacroix Rankings who could still win the 2022 world title. Realistically, it would take a monumental incident to create the room needed for Vasco Vilaca (POR), Pierre Le Corre (FRA), Lasse Luhrs (GER) or Antonio Serrat Seoane (ESP) to make up enough points to leapfrog the favourites.

[Taylor-Brown vs Duffy: The Abu Dhabi battle to become 2022 World Champion](#)

Two women have utterly dominated the World Triathlon Championship Series over the past 12 months in the race to become 2022 World Triathlon Champion. With three WTCS golds each to their name so far, Georgia Taylor-Brown (GBR) leads Flora Duffy (BER) by just 70 points heading into the final race of the year. Taylor-Brown's narrow lead in the Maurice Lacroix Rankings comes by virtue of silver in Leeds being her fourth scoring race, against Duffy's bronze in Yokohama. Cassandre Beaugrand (FRA) and Laura Lindemann (GER) are the only two other athletes to have won gold this campaign, but it is the consistency of Beth Potter (GBR) that leaves her in overall third, a position she would realistically be hoping to consolidate rather than build on next Friday, 25 November.
